- Long check out periods/no holds/keep downloaded books permanently!





# Librarians can now certify!!

 As of February 2021, per Act of Congress: Reading specialists, educators, librarians, and therapists can certify the eligibility of applicants with reading disabilities such as dyslexia.

 Previously, only medical professionals could certify.



## Identifying candidates




Up to **20%** of the U.S. population is thought to have **dyslexia**, the most common learning disability

Students who have an IEP that includes a reading disability


